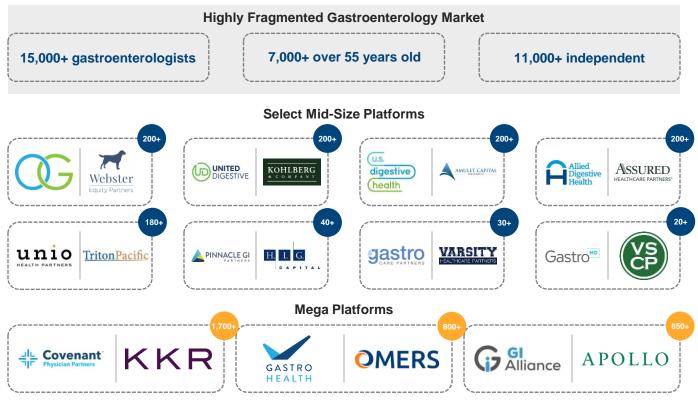
Healthcare: Gastroenterology



Market Observations

- Strong sector tailwinds and acquisitive platform companies present favorable transaction opportunities for gastroenterology ("GI") practices.
- GI is the second largest sub-specialty of internal medicine with over 21% of the population treated by over 15,000 physicians.
- GI is the most represented specialty among healthcare ASC cases making up 32% of all procedures in 2022.
- The American Cancer Society recently lowered its recommended age for colorectal cancer screening from 50 to 45, expanding the patient pool.
- EdgePoint expects M&A activity within the gastroenterology market to remain robust. Independent practices
 are expected to continue pursuing private equity investment for the capital necessary to meet increasing
 demand for GI services.

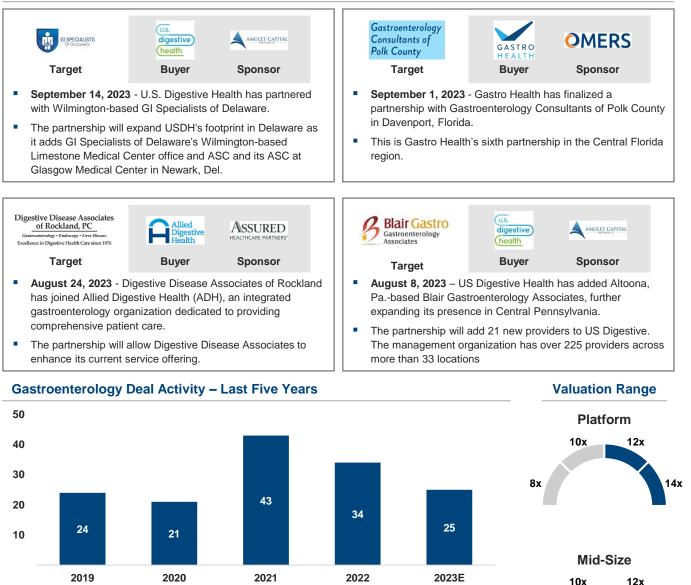
Market View Consolidation (Number of Providers)

- Gastroenterology practices have been going through a period of consolidation since 2016 when the most recent wave of GI-focused physician practice management companies started acquiring practices.
- M&A activity peaked in 2021, which was an extremely robust year for healthcare M&A. Activity has decreased slightly the last two years as interest rates increased and valuations tapered.
- Valuation multiple for a GI practice depends on a variety of factors including size of the practice, location, and deployment of technology including EMR, online booking, and referral management.
